Nova Scotia Contra Dance Festival 2015 A Stop on the Country Dance and Song Society North American Centennial Tour September 27 – October 3, 2015

We are delighted to announce that Nova Scotia has been chosen as one of seven stops on the Country Dance and Song Society Centennial Tour planned for 2015. The two local contra dance clubs are jointly hosting this event with Metro Association as the supporting organization.

Some of the best contra and community dance teachers and performers will be visiting Nova Scotia for a week to offer workshops, master classes, and special dances. The focus will be on developing the skills of dancers, dance leaders and musicians so that we can share our enthusiasm for this healthy recreation and develop a network of Community and Contra dances in Nova Scotia.

The Country Dance and Song Society describes itself as a "National leader in promoting participatory dance, music and song that have roots in North American and English culture. The CDSS believes in the joy that participatory dance, music and song bring to individuals and communities. Within the US and Canada, we educate, support and connect participants in these living traditions and we advocate for their vitality and sustainability into the future." The Country Dance and Song Society will have been in existence in North America for one hundred years in 2015.

Contra dancing is one of the ways for us to provide community dance events that are multigenerational and always open to the general public. We already have a strong participation in contra dancing in Halifax that has been greatly augmented by the enthusiastic leaders and dancers in the relatively new Halifax Contra Dancers. We are delighted that they are now officially part of Metro Association and bringing their youth and enthusiasm to this joint venture.
